Improve Your Video Skills with These Classes!

Video editing is a great place to start – either on PC or Mac – but, take a look below! Our classes include many other video-related skills. No pre-registration is required. Classes are open to Video Club members. Non-members are invited to join the club at the first class meeting or in the Video Lab, open Tuesday-Friday from 1-4 pm. *Membership in the Video Club Is \$15 a year for one person, \$20 for two at the same address.*

This fall, for the first time, we are also issuing a list of 33 entry-level video-related classes offered by Lynda.com, a leading online training firm. You can access these classes FREE with a library card from the Orange County Public Libraries, available at the Laguna Woods Branch in Laguna Wood City Hall. Pick up our Lynda.com class list in the Video Lab or download it from our website, videocluboflagunawoods.com.

In addition to attending classes, you can earn **certificates** in the use of Video Studio equipment (cameras, audio, switcher) and/or schedule individual **coaching** sessions on video topics where you need assistance.

NEW FREE CLASS: "Producing Dramatic Video," 6+ sessions. We will write, cast, shoot, edit, and do post-production sound for a dramatic video of approximately 10 minutes. A "call for scripts" (which may be of any genre, such as comedy, mystery, romance, etc.) has gone out to Village writers; however, the selected script may later be edited by the production team. **Open to members of Video One Productions,** the Video Club's team-based group, which welcomes all interested participants (must be a Video Club member). We invite writers, actors, camera operators, sound recordists, video editors, costume and makeup people, and graphic artists to join this effort. *No charge to participants.*

"How to Start A Video Editing Project," 1 session. During this 2-hour session, longtime Corel VideoStudio user Wolfgang Kutter will explain all the steps necessary to start an editing project using Corel VS and will introduce you to the basic settings. Says Wolfgang: "It will be very helpful to attend this class BEFORE you join Tom Nash's multi-week Corel VS training, which starts September 22. Even if you already use Corel VS, you might want to attend because we find that many Corel VS users are not too familiar with the project settings and preferences." *\$5 for members, \$20 for non-members (includes 2018-19 club membership).*

NEW CLASS: "Getting Better Video with Your iPad and iPhone," 3 sessions. Tools, tips, and techniques for video

projects. Did you know there is a way to manually set the focus and exposure on your iPhone and iPad? Or that there are four ways to take a picture from your device? This three-session class will help you get the most out of your iPad and iPhone through a variety of topics, including an overview of the camera and its hidden features, basics of shooting video, organizing your video and photos, Apple's useful tools (air drop, screen recording, markup), accessories for shooting video, and apps for editing and producing videos. *\$15 for members, \$30 for non-members (includes 2018-19 club membership).*

"Introduction to PC Video Editing with Corel VideoStudio," 3 sessions. Hands-on instruction in the basics of video editing. Especially for those with limited computer experience, Wolfgang's "How to Start A Video Editing Project" on September 15 is strongly recommended. You will learn how to bring your videos and photos into the timeline and edit them, adding titles, music, and narration; then how to make a finished video to share. Use Video Lab PCs or bring your own PC laptop equipped with VideoStudio X7 or later. Taking the entire three-session class is strongly recommended. *\$15 for members, \$30 for non-members (includes 2018-19 club membership).*

"Making Award-Winning 4-Minute Videos," 2 sessions. Start now to create your entry in the Video Club's Annual

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Short Video Contest, culminating with our “Academy” Awards Banquet in February. Learn how to plan and execute a video that will tell a compelling story and entertain the audience. Winning examples from previous contests will be shown and discussed. *\$10 for members, \$25 for non-members (includes 2018-19 club membership).*

“Making iMovie Trailers,” 2 sessions. Want to learn the easiest way to produce a video on your iPhone, iPad, or Mac? Then learn how to make an iMovie Trailer! Just select and tap your video and photos, add titles – and iMovie Trailers does the rest! A variety of templates and themes is available. In the first class, we’ll produce a trailer on “living in Laguna Woods Village.” Bring your own photos and videos or use the material provided. The second class will focus on fine-tuning your projects and showcasing your work. *\$10 for members, \$25 for non-members (includes 2018-19 club membership).*

“Introduction to Multi-Camera Studio Production,” 3 sessions. Hands-on class covering basic skills in the use of Studio cameras, lighting, audio, and switcher – skills needed to make videos in the Video Studio and strongly recommended for participation in our Video One Productions group. *\$15 for members, \$30 for non-members (includes 2018-19 club membership).*

“Introduction to YouTube,” 1 session. This hands-on class will show you how to create your own YouTube account (if you wish). Topics include an overview of YouTube, how to upload a video to YouTube, how to delete a YouTube video, installing and using YouTube Downloader, and how to download copyright-free music from the YouTube Audio Library. You’ll also view Chuck Hale’s original video tutorials on using YouTube, available for later review on all Video Lab PC computers. You’ll learn the basics and have your questions answered. Use Video Lab PCs or bring your own PC laptop. *\$5 for members, \$20 for non-members (includes 2018-19 club membership).*

“Movie-Making for Beginners with Apple Clips,” 3 sessions. Not yet ready for iMovie or want to produce a simpler or sillier movie? Then Clips is the app for you! With Clips, you can stitch together photos and video to create 1080 HD videos. You can easily add music, titles, voice-overs, and animated text and even convert your media into comic-book form. Much different than iMovie, Clips

produces a video in square format like Snapchat or Instagram. The Clips app can be down-loaded onto Apple devices running iOS 10.3 or later (using iPhone 5S or newer or iPad Mini 2 or later). *\$15 for members, \$30 for non members (includes 2018-18 club membership).*

NEW FREE CLASS: “Holiday Video Card-Making Workshop,” 1 session. For any iPhone or iPad user who knows Clips. Share the holiday spirit with a short video – sure to delight family and friends. We’ll present ideas for creating and distributing your video cards. *No charge to participants.*

“Making Amazing Movies with Your Smartphone,”

4 sessions. Instructor Scott Marvel (producer-director of Village Television’s popular “Thrive” video series) says: “I want to help everyone in the Village who has a smartphone learn how to tell the story in the camera. That’s the goal of this class. I’m going to give you the mindset to help you get good at making short videos that are not boring. You’ll produce your own video in class. You’ll learn to work quickly, making every shot count. You’ll also learn how to edit on your smartphone: Bring your clips into the editing program, review them, and make a rough-cut of your movie. Then re-arrange your clips for maximum impact and eliminate unwanted footage. Finally, add titles, music, and narration. Quickly create and share a short, interesting video.” *\$20 for members, \$35 for non-members (includes 2019 club membership).*

NEW CLASS: Improv Acting for the Camera. 3 sessions. If you’ve ever wanted to learn to improvise for Fun, for Work, or for Self-Confidence, this is the class for you!! Learn to trust your instincts, be spontaneous, make strong choices, and access your creativity abilities and flexibility!
